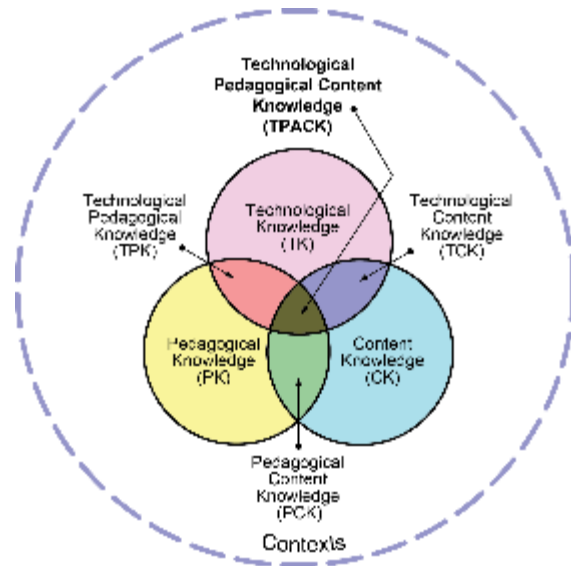
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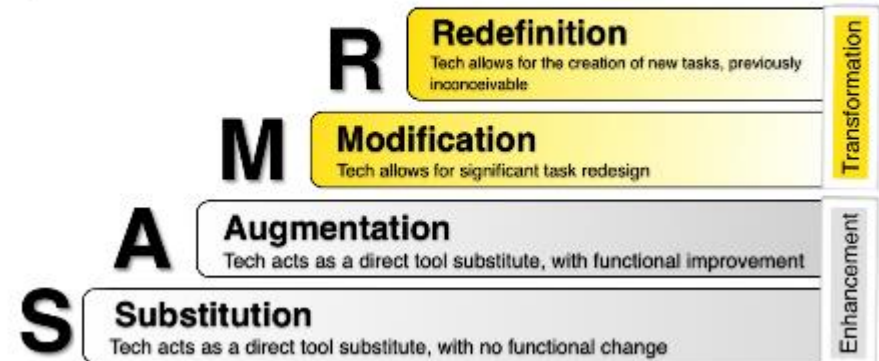

The SAMR Model



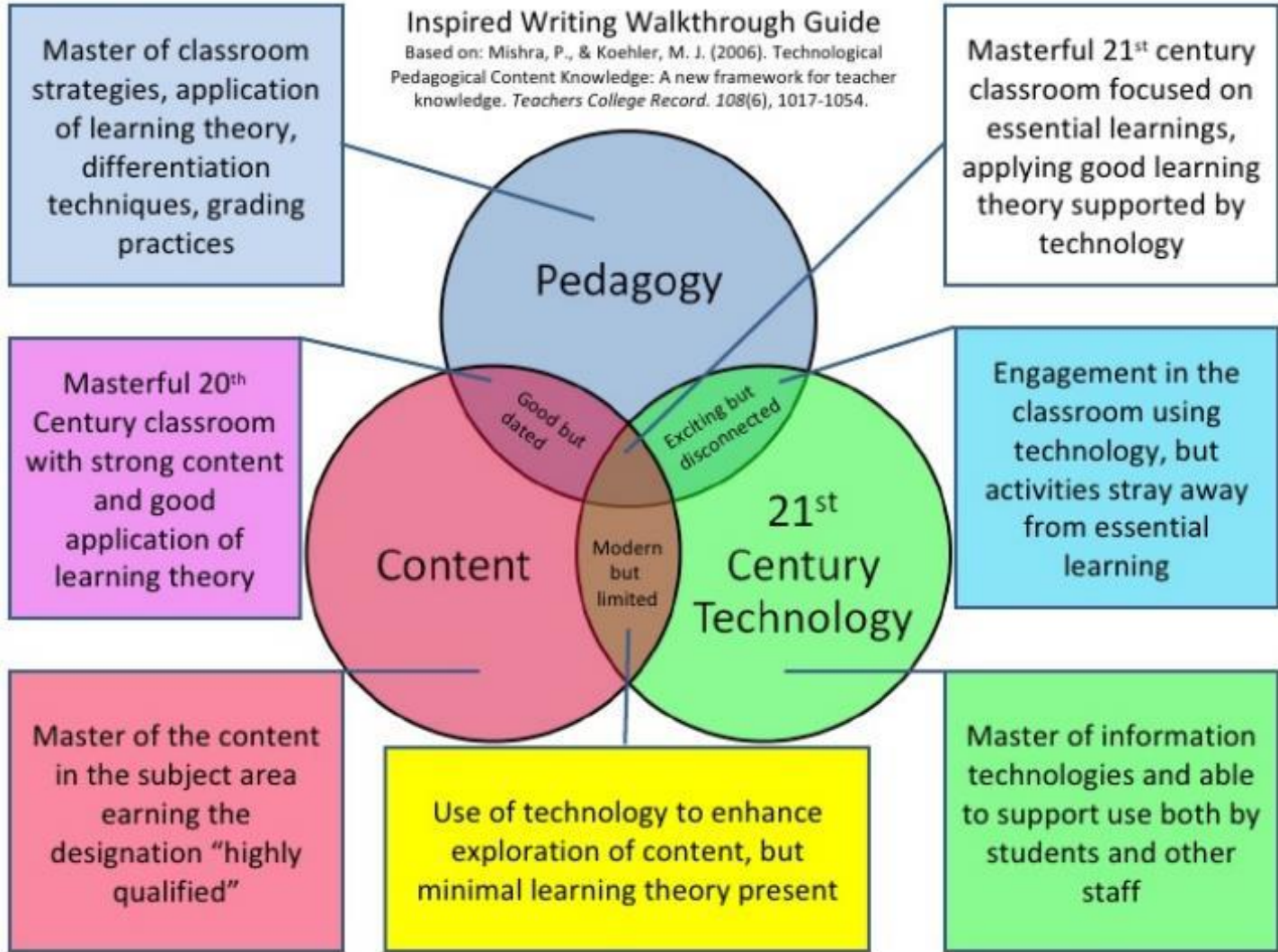

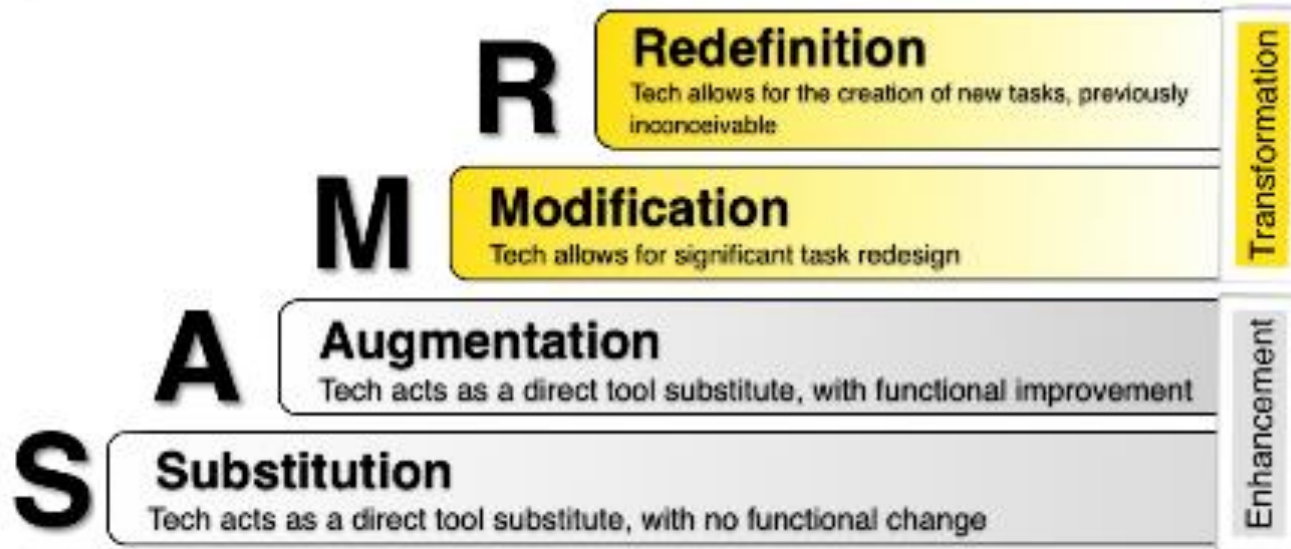

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The School Owned Notebook



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What does a school owned notebook mean?

- The College notebook is school owned property
- Student borrows notebooks for 24/7 access
- No extras cost to family ...except insurance claims - excess \$250, and repairs - under \$250
- Notebooks are returned to College at end of 3 years
- The College will make the decision upon disposal of the asset (notebook).



Why School Owned?

- Consistency of software applications in classes
- A maintained notebook image with regular and timely servicing and updates
 - Minimum - two yearly audits as well as a Term 4 re-imaging of all notebooks
- Can easily distribute commercially or school-based e-text when necessary
- Ability for school to **legally** place school-licensed specialised software on student borrowed notebooks
- Licensed and updated virus protection software
- Includes MS Office Professional

- Longer battery life (3 cell battery)
 - We have tested “normal use” with 7-8 hours response



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Comprehensive Support

- 3 year manufacturer's warranty (+3 year limited battery warranty)
- 3 year comprehensive insurance
- College ICCT Service Centre for software repair and support
- Servicing of equipment **must only occur** through school ICCT services department
- Annual condition audit and re-imaging
- LWT (Lenovo certified) technicians available on call for physical repair
- 48 hour turnaround on most warranty notebook repairs



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Insurance

- Provisions of the insurance policy are generous and cover all areas of accidental loss or damage **over** \$250. (Excess fee of \$250 per claim)
- All claims (outside of warranty) \leq \$250 will be paid by the parent/guardian to MacKillop College
- Warranty - Loan notebook given automatically
- Insurance and Repair - Loan notebook given upon return of incidence report
- The policy does not cover gross negligence



End of 3 Years

- All notebooks returned to the College
- All notebooks are checked for safety
- All notebooks taken back to their original state – including original operating system
- Year 9 students transitioning to Year 10 will be provided with a new notebook until the end of Year 12



Care and Security

- Notebooks ALWAYS transported in carry bag
- Lockers with secure combo locks
- Notebooks must be taken home overnight (if occasionally can't be taken home then must be stored in the ICCT Centre)
- Notebook must be transported in student backpack (car pick up excluded)
- College Notebook Asset – all serial numbers associated to the individual student



Notebook Education

All students will be given instructional time in

“The Care and Security of My Notebook”

- **Year 10 = 50 mins Year Level + 50 mins class upon deployment**
- **Year 7 = Digital Technologies Curriculum inc 100 minutes upon deployment**
